With a history spanning back to 1994, Delaware Valley Classical School employs a rigorous classical and Christian curriculum taught by a highly-qualified faculty who are not mere conveyors of information, but cultivators of minds and hearts. We emphasize our students' abilities to interpret a text, reason soundly, and express themselves clearly both orally and in writing. We seek to foster virtue and mature character in our students in addition to a well-rounded competence which is applicable to all facets of life.

HALLMARKS

ENGAGING GREAT IDEAS

Our students engage the great ideas of history via Socratic discussions through literature, poetry, theology, art, music, and science. Students study original texts, some of which are listed below.

HOUSE PARTICIPATION

Each student, grade 7-12, is assigned membership in one of four school Houses. The House program fosters leadership opportunities through academic and athletic competition, mentoring of younger students, and community service, all of which creates a vibrant school community.

RHETORIC

A hallmark of Delaware Valley is the emphasis placed on written and oral communication. Students learn to present truth, goodness, and beauty and express themselves in meaningful ways. As the culmination of their educations, students research and write an original 20+ page paper on an issue of theological, cultural, or political import and defend it before a panel of judges.

EDUCATING THE WHOLE PERSON

The mission of Delaware Valley is to assist parents in preparing their children to excel in every duty and calling God has for them throughout their lives by providing a classical and Christ-centered curriculum designed to equip our graduates with the tools to acquire, process, express, and defend knowledge from a Biblical worldview.

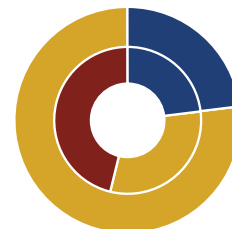
